The alley is a passageway only about 10 ft high and 60 ft. long, with lights recessed into the ceiling for its full length, The north wall is completely covered with ceramic tiles with pictures of the printers, printing offices, and events in Fleet Street The pictures below can only give you a very faint idea of the wealth of material here - your really need to come and see it for yourself.
